### More H1N1 Vaccination Clinics Scheduled

**St. Charles County, Missouri** – H1N1 vaccine continues to arrive in St. Charles County on a weekly basis. Providers have vaccinated thousands of county residents, but many others who are at high risk from H1N1 influenza have still not taken advantage of the opportunity to get vaccinated.

- Pregnant women
- People age 6 months to 24 years
- People age 25 to 64 with health conditions that make them vulnerable to complications from the flu
- People who live with or care for infants under 6 months of age
- Health care and emergency services workers
